

FLU SEASON IS COMING!

The Disease: Influenza is a highly contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses A and B. It is a viral infection transmitted by respiratory secretions through sneezing or coughing. On average, **one in ten adults contract influenza every year.** While most healthy people fully recover from the illness, outbreaks of flu can have a serious impact wherever they occur, sometimes leading to extended absences from work.

The flu is often brought home from work and shared with family members!

Your employer is hosting a convenient flu vaccination program right here at work!

Symptoms: Fever, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, headache, muscle aches, and often extreme fatigue. Most people recover completely within 1-2 weeks. However, compared with other viral respiratory infections like common colds, influenza causes more severe complications such as pneumonia in vulnerable groups.

Prevention and Control: The viruses that cause influenza continually change over time, which enables them to evade the immune system of its host. Rapid changes in the influenza virus make it necessary to make annual changes in the composition of the vaccine. Therefore prevention and control are thus the only realistic means of dealing with influenza.

The flu season runs from November through April.

Vaccine: The vaccine is one dose, administered in the arm muscle by a nurse from Saint Francis Hospital.

Risks: The risk of the vaccine causing life-threatening harm is extremely small. The viruses used to make the vaccine are killed, so you cannot get the flu from the vaccine. Most people who get influenza vaccine have no problems at all, although some have mild reaction such as soreness and redness where the vaccine was given, fever or aches that last 1-2 days after the shot.

Pregnant women must present written permission from their doctor before getting the vaccine. Individuals who are sensitive or allergic to thimerosal, latex, eggs or egg products or are currently ill with an active neurological disease should be vaccinated by their private healthcare professional.

Convenience: You can get your flu shot without leaving work, standing in long lines at a drug or grocery store, or making an appointment. The cost of the vaccine is about the same as the co-pay for an office visit with your personal medical provider.
